Déjà Vu at St. Johns Botanical Garden and Nature Preserve

Originally scheduled for Sunday, October 1st, 2023, the Grand Opening was pushed back until Saturday, October 14th, 2023, due to steady overnight rain. Since the garden was still open, a few brave souls showed up to take a quick tour around the garden.

- 3) Once on the 'Send Money' page, type 'payments@cfpacs.com' in the 'To' field.

- 4) From there you will be taken to a secure page where you can enter your name, address, and credit card information.
